Artist, Teacher of Tolerance, Promoter of Peace and now Author:

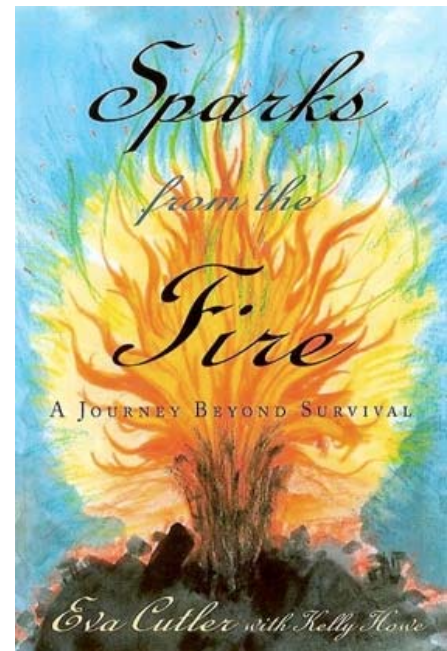
Sparks from the Fire, A Journey Beyond Survival.

A native of Budapest, Hungary, and a survivor of the Bergen Belsen Nazi concentration camp, Eva Cutler has participated in the IJCU's Youth & Prejudice: Reducing Hatred Conference sharing her story with thousands of middle and high school students.

Growing up in Budapest, Hungary, in a family rich with love and culture, and with her own close friends and spunk, young Eva Friedrich had a promising adolescence— until the Nazis stole it. That she lived through the march to Bergen Belsen and her internment are indeed miracles.

But Eva's story of survival only begins with her liberation. She takes the reader through her recuperation in Sweden; her transition to American life; her difficult marriage; the never-ending challenges of motherhood; and her discovery of her own talents and passions.

In this process, she contemplates the meaning of survival, the existence of a Higher Being and the games people play at others' expense with unconscionable arrogance. She provides readers with much to ponder, but her biggest gift is the inspiration that comes from her indomitable spirit that continues to propel her to work for peace and tolerance.
