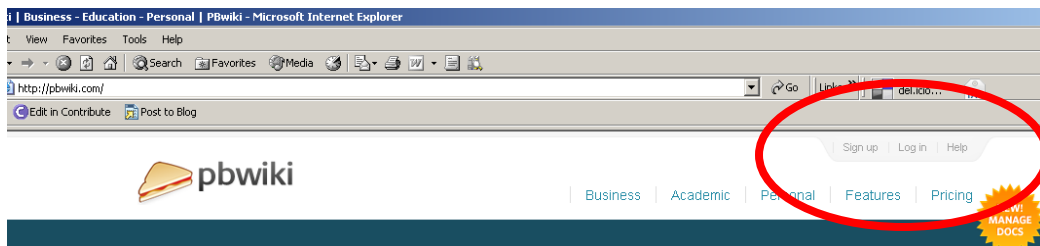

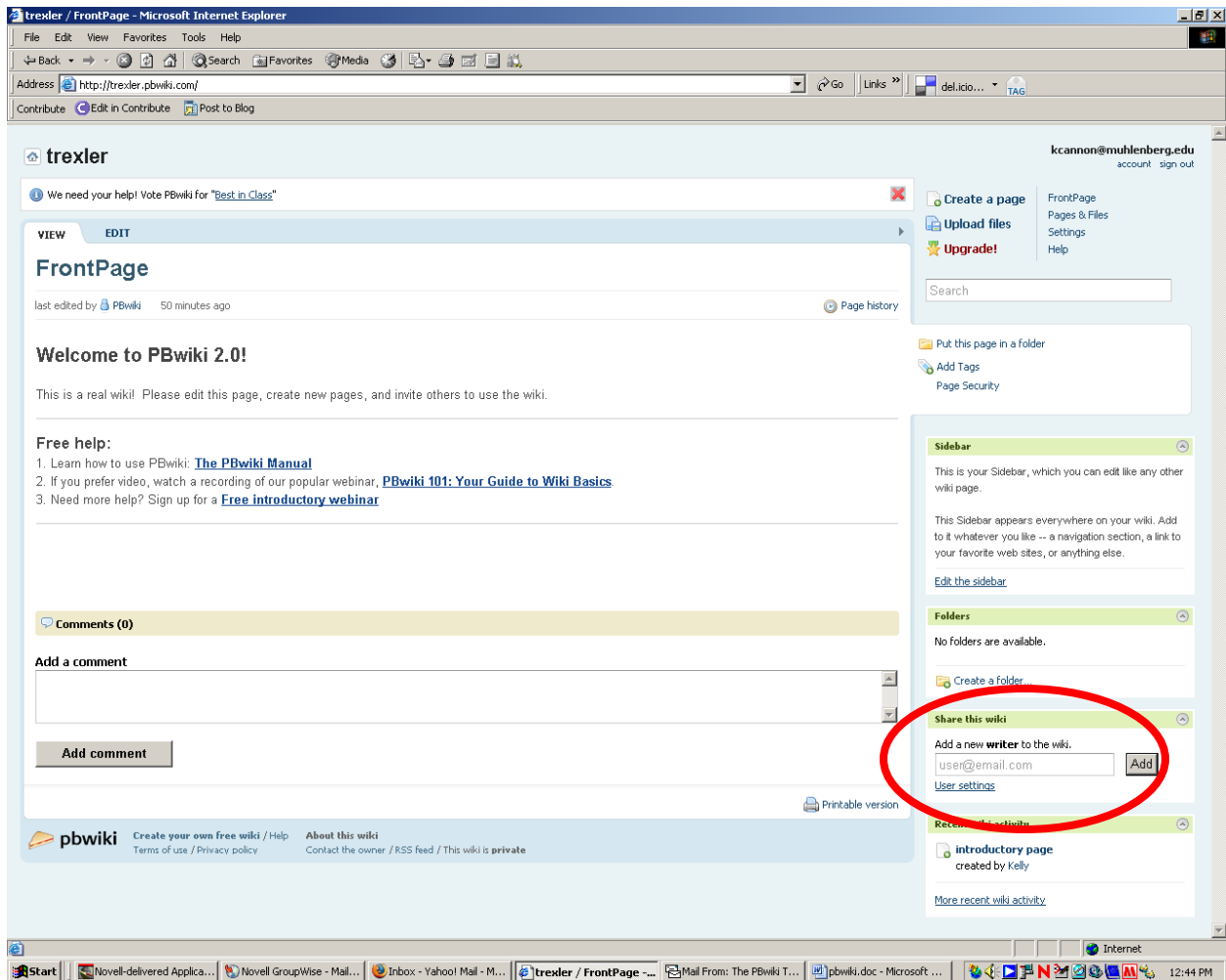
Check your email for a confirmation that your account has been created. You are now ready to begin using PBwiki.

II. Adding users to your account

From the main PBwiki page (<http://pbwiki.com>), log in to your account.



Enter the PBwiki (you can make as many as you want) that you're interested in adding users to. You will then be taken to the "FrontPage" (home page) of that particular wiki. Begin adding new users by inserting their email addresses, one at a time, into the space provided under "Share this wiki."

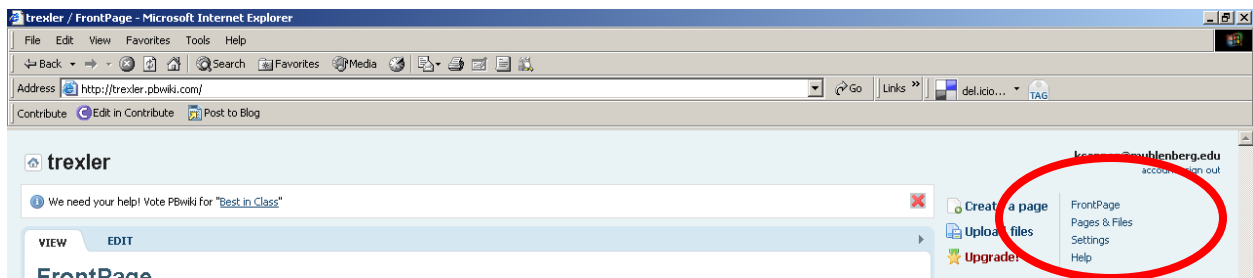


By default, users will be added as “writers,” meaning that they have full editing but no administrative privileges. If you want to assign a user a different level of privileges, click on “User settings.”

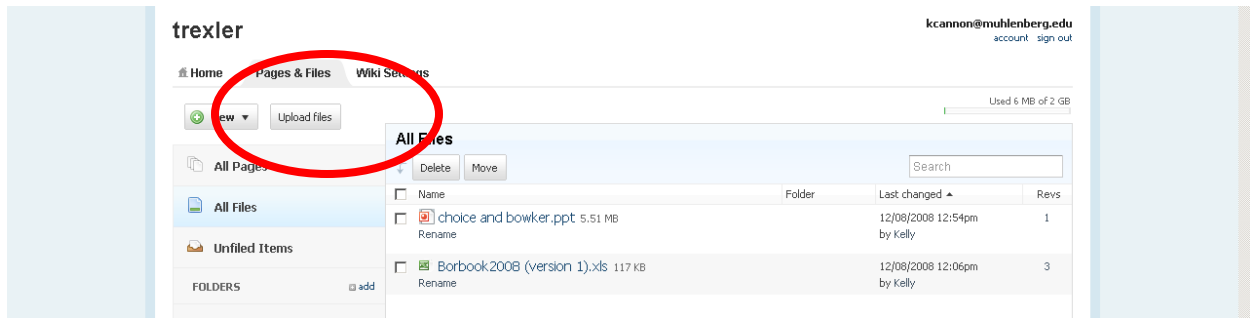
At this point, all the new users you have added will be invited by email to join your PBwiki. Once they create an account and login, they can begin reading and editing any pages or files found in your PBwiki.

III. Uploading files to your PBwiki

From the FrontPage, choose “Pages and files.”



Then pick “Upload files.”

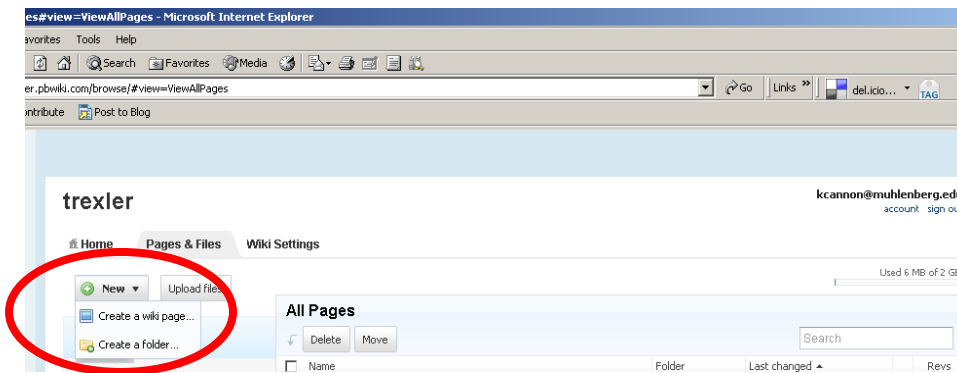


IV. Editing files

Note that the files listed in the image above all specify the number of times a file has been edited, and who did the editing. If recovering all versions of a file is important, it is advisable to rename the file each time a file is edited and uploaded. That way all versions of files will easily recoverable.

V. Creating and editing pages in PBwiki

Besides uploading existing files, you can create and edit word-processed documents entirely within PBwiki. From the "Pages and Files" page, simply choose New and then Create a Wiki Page.



Once a new page is created, you will be returned to a list of all pages, at which point you can choose to Edit a page.
