Discipline: The discipline corresponds to the department names.

General Academic Requirements: A display of courses that could fulfill a GAR if successfully completed.

Pre/Co-Requisites: Courses that must have been successfully taken prior to registering for the current course or which may be taken at the same time as the current course.

Course: An eight character code that uniquely identifies a set of instruction that will take place this term. It consists of a three-character discipline prefix, a three-digit course number, and a two-digit section number. It is very important to type the course key completely and accurately onto the online Registration form (ex: ACT10101). The course number refers to the catalog description and typically conveys a message about the level of instruction one might expect from the course.

000-099	no credit
100-199	introductory (no prerequisites)
200-299	intermediate
300-499	advanced
500-599	seminars (variable titles)
900-999	individualized instruction (internships, independent studies, research, etc.)

Section Numbers: Section numbers delineate between multiple offerings of the same course during the same term. In addition, however, they indicate whether a course is being offered through the day or evening school. Traditional day students may only register for courses whose section numbers are below 50. Wescoe evening students should register for courses whose section numbers are above 50.

Notes: Additional information about a course of which you should be aware before you attempt to enroll.

Course Units: Upon successful completion of the course, you will be awarded the number of units indicated.

Sessions: Indicates whether the course is a "Day" college course (Semester Session) or a "Wescoe" college course (Fifteen Week, Saturday, etc.).

Select Course: Clicking on the box indicates that you are choosing to put this course on your online Registration form.

Course Status: Indicates whether the course is available for registration and has seats available or is fully enrolled (closed).

Meeting Times: All Muhlenberg "day college" courses are scheduled between 8:00 am and 10:00 pm. "R" refers to Thursday and "U" to Sunday.
