# Muhlenberg College Public Health Program 

## 2024 Pennsylvania Health Survey

The following report examines opinions regarding public health issues in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in 2024. The report provides an overview of key findings from the 2024 Pennsylvania Health Survey. The survey was conducted in the Spring of 2024 by the Muhlenberg College Institute of Public Opinion (MCIPO) in conjunction with the Muhlenberg College Public Health Program.

## KEY FINDINGS

1. Seven out of ten Pennsylvanians provide positive ratings to the quality of health care in the state, the highest marks since the question was first asked in 2019.
2. Support for legalization of marijuana in Pennsylvania remains unchanged from 2023, with about half ( $49 \%$ ) of adults in the state supporting this option, and about three in ten (30\%) opposing such a change.
3. For the fourth year in a row there was an increase in the percentage of Commonwealth residents reporting their mental health was better than a year ago, with four in ten reporting a positive change, about one in ten indicating a negative change, and about half reporting no difference over the last year.
4. Over half ( $54 \%$ ) of Pennsylvanians indicate that opioid abuse is a major or minor problem in the community that they live in.
5. Over four out of ten (43\%) Keystone State residents report that politics and current events are a major source of stress in their lives, with this factor outpacing personal finances ( $22 \%$ ), work ( $22 \%$ ), and relationships with family and friends ( $9 \%$ ) and a cause of stress.
6. About one in five ( $22 \%$ ) Commonwealth adults report always or often feeling anxious in the last twelve months.
7. Over two out of three ( $67 \%$ ) adult Pennsylvanians agree that E-cigarettes and vaping pose significant health risks.
8. A majority of Pennsylvanians believe the state needs stronger restrictions on access to firearms with about six in ten $(59 \%)$ agreeing that such restrictions are needed, and four in ten ( $41 \%$ ) disagreeing with the need for such measures.
9. Most (59\%) Commonwealth residents disagree that the state should make access to abortions more limited, with a substantial minority ( $41 \%$ ) agreeing that added restrictions should be put in place.
10. Over four in ten ( $41 \%$ ) of adult residents of Pennsylvania believe that domestic violence in the state is a crisis.

## METHODOLOGY

This report provides results of a telephone survey of 415 adult residents of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Interviews were conducted between February 12 and March 5, 2024. Respondents were interviewed in English on both landlines $(\mathrm{n}=83)$ and cell phones $(\mathrm{n}=332)$. With a randomly selected sample of respondents, the margin of error for the survey is $+/-6 \%$ at a $95 \%$ level of confidence. Margins of error for questions with smaller sample size will be larger. In addition to sampling error, one should consider that question wording and other fielding issues can introduce error or bias into survey results. The data has been weighted to gender, age, race, and educational attainment to 2024 population parameters for the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania provided by the United States Census Bureau. The calculation of sampling error takes into account design effects due to the weighting of the sample to the population parameters identified above. In order to reach a representative sample of Pennsylvania adult residents, landlines and cell phones were called up to 3 times. Interviews were conducted by Communication Concepts of Easton Pennsylvania. Due to rounding, the totals provided in the frequency report may not total 100 percent. Data analysis and weighting were conducted through the use of the SPSS statistical software package Version 29.0. The survey instrument was designed by Dr. Christopher P. Borick of the MCIPO in conjunction with the Muhlenberg College Public Health Program and is presented in its entirety in the following section of the report. The survey was funded by the MCIPO.
